

COMMON ELEMENTS OF FAIRY TALES

- 1. A fairy tale begins with "Once upon a time..."
- 2. Fairy tales happen in the long ago.
- 3. Fairy Tales have fantasy and make believe in them.
- 4. Fairy Tales have clearly defined Good characters vs. Evil characters.
- 5. Royalty is usually present in a fairy tale, a beautiful princess/handsome prince.

- 6. There may be magic with giants, elves, talking animals, witches or fairies.
- 7. Fairy tales have a problem that needs to be solved.
- 8. It often takes three tries to solve the problem.
- 9. Fairy tales have happy endings "they all lived happily ever after."
- **10.** Fairy tales usually teach a lesson or have a theme.

Techniques of Satire:

- Satire: The use of humor, irony, exaggeration, or ridicule to expose and criticize people's stupidity or vices (flaw or weakness).
- **Exaggeration:** A statement that makes something worse or better than it really is.
- Irony: A figure of speech in which words are used in such a way that their intended meaning is different from the actual meaning of the words. Example: "The name of Brian's biggest dog is Tiny."
- <u>Humor</u>: A literary tool that makes the audience laugh or intends to induce amusement or laughter.
- Parody: An imitation of a writer, artist, subject, or genre in such a
 way as to make fun of or comment on the original work.
- Reversal: The sudden reversal of fortune in a story, play, or narrative in which there is an observable change in direction.
