

SUBJECT-VERB AGREEMENT: PAST TENSE

What Does Subject-Verb Agreement Look Like in Past Tense?

- Both singular and plural subjects take the same verb form.
- It is usually formed by adding “-d” or “-ed” to the end.
- There are some irregular verbs that don't follow this rule.
Examples-spoke, drove, ran.

Examples:

- Plural-The dogs ran.
- Singular-The dog ran.

- Plural-The tour guides talked to the tourist.
- Singular-The tour guide talked to the tourist.
